
Emergency Broadband Benefit Program

THE FCC'S PLAN TO CONNECT ALL AMERICANS TO THE INTERNET





"No one should have to choose between paying their Internet bill or paying to put food on the table." - Jessica Rosenworcel, Acting Chairwoman

Bringing affordable Internet service to eligible households for distance working, virtual learning, and critical telehealth care by providing:

- A discount of up to \$50 per month for Internet service (and up to \$75 per month for households on Tribal lands)
- A one-time discount up to \$100 from participating providers for a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet by contributing \$10 to \$50 towards the purchase

Qualifiers:

- FCC's Lifeline program
- SNAP Lunch program
- Loss of income (tax filings between \$99K to \$198K this past year)
- Federal Pell Grant awardee
- Receive Government support (Unemployment, Medicaid, etc.)

Requires the participation of Internet providers to bring service
